The Almshouse Association - who we are and what we do

Almshouses are steeped in history, they have been providing safe and secure homes for over a 1000 years. Almshouses are run by charities, they are micro communities which have been created by philanthropists over centuries. Almshouses are first and foremost charities which operate for the wellbeing of the residents.

90% of Almshouses are for the local community and are all run by a leadership of local trustees who have an understanding of local needs and are accountable to the community.

The scale of Almshouses tends to be small, usually 6-12 units and are distinct of architecture, often a square horseshoe, providing a sense of community but some Almshouse charities have provision to support over 100 Almshouses.

Almshouses are distinct from other forms of housing because of their retention of 'historic license', this is not the same as a lease. They are exempt from 'Right to Buy' which is important because the homes remain available for their purpose in perpetuity.

There are 1,700 almshouse charities in the UK providing homes for 36,000 people living in today - more almshouses are being built now than ever before.

The Almshouse Association has been established for 75 years and is the voice for the movement and we are the voice to Government for Almshouses, we support with funding, guidance, training and seminars to our membership and our ambition is that Almshouses are recognized as the exemplar form of community housing.

Almshouses have been and will be a significant solution to the affordable housing crisis for centuries to come.



Edmund Sawyer Almshouses

The charity was first established in the 17th Century for six women in need in Kettering. The building is Grade 11 star listed. It is reputed to be the oldest building in Kettering.

The charity had fallen into poor condition in 2018 and the board of the Leonard Hackett Memorial Trust stepped in and took over the charity. The team rescued the buildings carrying out immediate refurbishment.

In 2023 Historic England funded a complete refurbishment and in 2025 new electric heating was added.

The residents have been in place since 2018.

Time commitment

Trustees are expected to attend a minimum of 5 meetings per year. This includes four trustee Review Meetings and the AGM.

Given the size of the charity, it is likely that trustees would also be involved in occasional ad hoc meetings relating to property or resident issues.

The Almshouse Associate offers training in a one day course, and it would be anticipated that new trustees would attend the Almshouse Way Training Course (one day).


